Assistance to NGOs and support to delegates attending conferences in Geneva.





EARLY CHILDHOOD in the City of Geneva



Distribution of roles and responsibilities

Cantonal level

- Define general rules
- Authorise the opening of childcare facilities (SAPE)
- Monitor the operations of the SAPE

Municipal level

- Provide places from the end of maternity leave until children start school
- Inspect and supervise the operations of the SAPE
- Approve the quality of the childcare

<u>Early childhood day-care structures</u>:

Private legal facilities, subsidised by the City of Geneva, organised in the form of an association or foundation caring for children aged between 4 months and 4 full years

- Human resources management
- Compliance with data protection
- Ethical reflection

Early childhood information bureau (BIPE)

- Takes registrations for all early childcare structures located within the municipal territory and subsidised by the City of Geneva
- · Manages a waiting list based on the allocation criteria
- Sends the active applications to the childcare structures according to the places available.

Early childhood information bureau (BIPE)

Specifications

- Registration from the twelfth week of pregnancy
- Registrations must be renewed every six months
- Applications handled in order of seniority
- No places guaranteed. Other possibilities:
 - > Approved child minders (list available from the BIPE)
 - > Approved parental assistants (list available at www.proju.ch)



Place allocation and priority criteria

- Resident or working in the City of Geneva
- Both parents working (employment, training, unemployed or job-seeking registered with the ORP)
- Brother or sister already registered with a SAPE

NB:

- If a family moves outside the city limits during the course of the year, the children cannot retain their place after the end of the school year.
- "Ô comme 3 pommes" (52 places) primarily welcomes the children of staff of IOs, NGOs and diplomatic representations.



Fees

- Calculation of fees adapted to the financial capacity of the users according to a price chart available online:
 - ➤ Minimum price of CHF 1,132 for a relevant income of CHF 16,000 or less*
 - ➤ Maximum price of CHF 25,000 for a relevant income of CHF 220,000 and more*
- For siblings:
 - > Half-price for the second child
 - > Free for the third child





Compulsory School (regular education)

- 8 years **primary school** 4 12 years old
 - Elementary cycle (4 -8)
 - Medium cycle (8-12)
- 3 years orientation cycle (lower secondary school), 12 -15 years old
- Compulsory education (school or professional training) until the age of 18

ELEMENTARY CYCLE 1^P, 2P, 3^P, 4^P MIDDLE CYCLE 5^P, 6^P, 7^P, 8^P

What shall I do on arrival?

- Primary school
 - Arrange an appointment at the primary school facility closest to the child's residence area/district
 - Email or call the general direction to identify the closest school facility

How can I get the material?

- Primary school
 - Manuals and material are provided for free by the school staff
 - Provided by the family : spor's ioes,
 slippers, "basane" (ballerina: ippers in
- Orientationacles
 - Manuals and material are provided for free by the school staff
 - Provided by the family: sports outfits and shoes, some other items may be required by the teachers (or by your child!)
- · Upper secondary school:
 - Manuals and material are to be bought by the family, according to teacher's instructions



What grade will my child be assigned to ?

- Primary school
 - Decision based on date of birth (DOB)
- Orientation cycle
 - Decision based on DOB and educational background
 - Admission tests to determine the assigned group / section
- Upper secondary
 - Depends on admission tests results and the student's professional project



Welcoming non French speaking pupils/students in Geneva educational system



Primary school

- Pupils aged 4-6: 100% regular class, with individual support if needed
- **Pupils aged >6**: 50% in regular class, 50% in welcome class for max. 12 months, essentially dedicated to French language
- No formalized assessment for max 24 months after arrival.
- Welcome class is located in the same facility as regular class or nearby



Orientation cycle

- Schooling: 100% in a welcome class
- 10/32 periods (45 minutes) dedicated to French courses
- 3/32 periods dedicated to mother language courses, if available
- Progressive integration into regular class through trial periods as soon as considered possible



Upper secondary school

- Schooling: 100% in welcome class for 1 year. Can be extended in some cases. Then, transition class for 1 year to prepare access to academic or professional training
- 11 periods dedicated to French courses
- 2 periods dedicated to mother language courses, if available
- 12 facilities in Geneva

First things to think about....

- Your child's age and previous educational background
- Your family situation
- Your professional context (How long will you be in Geneva? Will you be moving on soon?)

... next identify the things that are important for you regarding your choice of school ?

- A curriculum based on a particular educational philiosophy / methodology
- A national system
- More emphasis on certain areas of study
- Language options
- Support structures
- Extra-curricular activities
- ..

Starting to look at schools

Whilst exploring the different websites, you may want to look for the following:

- A clear mission and educational philosophy
- A vision for teaching and learning
- Clear information on the curriculum
- The presentation of examination results
- Organisation of the school day
- The role of parents
- Policy documents
- Extra-curricular activities
- Community activities
- Select the schools which are the best match for your child
- Contact the schools and arrange to meet the person responsible foradmissions



Visiting the school

During the visit and the meeting, you might want to ask the following questions:

Education

- Detailed questions about the curriculum (place of languages, technology, arts, sports...)
- Is there a university guidance?/a university counselling service?
- How does the school perceive its own strengths
- What are the **added values** of the school?

Practical daily life

- How is the school structured? Who is your contact person?
- What about the pastoral structure?
- How are parents involved in the life of the school?
- What is the discipline policy?
- Practical aspects: costs, canteen, public transport, ...
- Is there a clear admissions procedure and are terms and conditions clearly communicated?

Match between the school, the dtl and the family situation + your plans for the future.

Final considerations

- Visit the school during school hours
- Make sure your child visits the school and sees a classroom in action
- Speak to different stakeholders

Once you have met with the different admissions departments, consider the best match between the school, your child and your family situation, as well as the best match with your plans for the future.
