- Review your contract: Know your end date, renewal terms, and notice period.
- Clarify your status: Are you a consultant, JPO, UNV, or temporary staff? Each has different mobili
- Talk to your supervisor: Ask about upcoming opportunities or extensions early.
- 2. Update Your Career Materials
- CV & P-11: Tailor for both UN and external roles.
- LinkedIn: Highlight your UN experience, fieldwork, and cross-cultural skills.
- Cover letters: Practice writing concise, impact-driven narratives.
- 3. Map Your Transferable Skills
- Identify skills like:
 - Project coordination
 - Monitoring & evaluation
- Stakeholder engagement
- Data analysis or reporting
- Use a skills inventory to match these with roles in NGOs, INGOs, or other UN agencies.
- 4. Explore Internal & External Opportunities
- Internal:
 - Apply for temporary job openings (TJOs) on Inspira.
 - Look for inter-agency secondments or surge deployments.
- External:
 - Check platforms like ReliefWeb, Devex, UNjobs.org.
 - Consider consulting or short-term assignments with NGOs or think tanks.

- Focus on in-demand areas:
- Data literacy, digital tools, climate adaptation, gender mainstreaming, etc.
